Dear Parishioners,

I invite you all to prepare for the joy of Christmas by observing some form of penance in Advent, and by obtaining a plenary indulgence on our feast day. As I mentioned last week, our Archbishop is granting us this favour this year, and I regard it as a tremendous grace from God.

What is an indulgence? The Catechism explains: 'An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven.' (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* # 1471)

"Sin has a *double consequence*. Grave sin deprives us of communion with God and therefore makes us incapable of eternal life." This is the 'eternal punishment' of sin. On the other hand every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified either here on earth, or after death in the state called Purgatory. This purification frees one from what is called the 'temporal punishment' of sin. These two punishments must not be conceived of as a kind of vengeance inflicted by God from without, but as following from the very nature of sin. A conversion from a fervent charity can attain the complete purification of the sinner in such a way that no punishment would remain." (CCC #1472).

To obtain this plenary indulgence for our feast day, there are four requirements:

- 1) Attend Mass and receive communion on Sat. Dec. 8th at 9:00 a.m.
- 2) Receive the sacrament of Reconciliation (our Parish service is Dec. 5th at 7:00 p.m.)
- 3) Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (for example, an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a Glory Be)
- 4) Have one's soul completely removed from attachment to any form of sin. (This last requirement may seem impossible, but don't worry, and don't be scrupulous! God will reward all our sincere efforts to be detached from sin).

It is important to remember that a plenary indulgence is not magic. The devotional acts in themselves - prayer, confession, communion - serve to detach our souls from sin, to purify and sanctify us.
