YEAR OF FAITH CORNER:

Introduction to the Nicene Creed - Part One. One recommendation from Pope Benedict XVI for the *Year of Faith* is to learn by heart the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed (also called the Nicene Creed). The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us that the "Nicene Creed draws its great authority from the fact that it stems from the first two ecumenical Councils (in 325 and 381). It remains common to all the great Churches of both East and West to this day (n. 195)." In the new Missal, we see a fresh translation of the creed that introduces a number of additions and clarifications to the creed in the previous Missal. These changes reflect a closer translation from the original Latin containing important articulations of our faith. This year, using the *Catechism* as our guide, we will examine this foundational expression of our faith more closely.
