#### PASTOR'S CORNER

When Jesus said to His disciples that they were the salt of the earth and the light of the world, He was simply challenging them to make a difference. He challenges us in exactly the same way. We, too, are called to be salt and light to the world.

As we all know, salt preserves food. It is also a great seasoning, enhancing the taste of the food. It means that without salt, food can be quite tasteless and, in fact, quite boring. Similarly, light brightens our surroundings. It helps us to see where we are going instead of leaving us to grope around in the dark. In the absence of light, it is impossible to see the beauty of God's creation.

#### Called to Make a Difference

Our readings today are about practical Christianity. They remind us of what it means to be a Christian, that is, to make a difference. Salt and light in some ways might seem quite common, but, characteristically, they make a huge difference! So, the Lord Jesus is telling us today that we are to be salt and light for all those we meet. What that means is that we, as Christians, must live exemplary lives so that by observing us, others may find meaning and a direction for their own lives.
