PASTOR'S CORNER

I hope everyone is having a great summer so far. Thanks be to God! Since this edition of the bulletin is for the month of August, as usual, I shall try to give a brief reflection on all of the readings of the whole month.

18th Sunday – August 3rd

“You open your hand to feed us, Lord...” In today’s gospel, Jesus shows His power and compassion. The people were hungry. Moved with pity for them, He blessed five loaves and two fish and with it He fed the crowds. This great miracle reminds us, among other things, of Jesus’ power and His loving compassion towards us. He provides us with food and challenges us to feed one another.

19th Sunday – August 10th

“Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.” Jesus not only provides food for the hungry, He also delivers those in distress who call out to Him. There are times in our lives when the storm of misfortune, sickness and family tragedy seem to engulf us. There are times when our faith is tested and we feel like saying, “Enough is enough”! At such times, that same Jesus Who loves us more than we can ever imagine, will say to us: “Take heart. Do not be afraid. I am with you always.”

20th Sunday – August 17th

“Woman, great is your faith.” Today’s gospel story is a powerful reminder that Jesus’ healing is for all and it is also an invitation to always put our faith and trust in Him. This was exactly what the woman in today’s gospel did: she prayed with faith and trusted and, sure enough, she got more than she bargained for. The story challenges us to have faith in God and be more trusting. If we do, He will definitely answer our prayers.

21st & 22nd Sunday – August 24th & 31st

“Who do you say that I am?” Today Jesus asks each of us that question, and we have to answer! Just like Peter, our answer must, however, come from our personal experience of the Lord, our deep faith in Him. The more personal and convincing our response, the more it will shape our lives and the more we are drawn into a deeper relationship with the Lord!
