African Mission Appeal Is there anybody in the parish who would consider responding to the requests of some priests in various parts of Africa? Once again, I have been asked for Tylenol and razors and seminarians are in dire need of pens. A desperate appeal has come in from a rural part of Kenya from Fr. Peter, who is in a small parish in a very dangerous area. He is surrounded by Muslims who are hostile to the few Catholics in the area. The children of the parish are very hungry and undernourished and the foreign-aid groups like Chalice won't go there, as it's too dangerous. Fr. Benjamin in Zambia is praying that somebody will help a family whose house just burned down. There is no insurance and no welfare system there. The medical bills are going to be enormous and the family lost everything they possess. The grandmother is still in hospital, the mother is in critical condition in intensive care and may not survive and the three children, who have been discharged, need to be fed and clothed.
