The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. It is, therefore, the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith.'" (CCC No. 234)

Although we may not be able to fully understand the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, the feast itself is a powerful reminder of who we are – that we are made in the image and likeness of God and are called to imitate the love, communion, unity, oneness of the Trinity.
