The Example of John the Baptist

On Friday, we celebrated the Nativity of John the Baptist. John was called to be the precursor of Christ, one who is to prepare His way. John answered the called and recognized Jesus as the Lamb; that He will increase while he will decrease. Around this time every year, we have what we call the summer solstice - the longest day of the year. Gradually from June to December the days begin to be shorter particularly for those in the northern hemisphere! From around Christmas time back until June again the light is gradually increasing. So the birth of John the Baptist brings the decrease of light! And at the birth of Christ, six months later, the light begins to gain its strength again! St. Augustine put it beautifully thus: "Christ is born, and the days start increasing; John is born, and the days start diminishing. So let man's honor diminish, God's honor increase, so that the honor of man may be found in the honor of God."

Inmates should not be forgotten or regarded as beyond hope. If we call ourselves disciples of Jesus, we are asked to look at ways to be the presence of Jesus to them. **Take Action:**

- Send care packages, bibles, spiritual reading materials to those in prison.

- Pray for inmates and their families.

- Visit the *Prison Fellowship Canada* website to find out about prison ministry and what you can do to help (e.g. pen-pal program, prison visits, becoming a <u>prayer partner</u>, etc.)

- Support programs that provide holiday gifts for inmates and their families (e.g. *Angel Tree Christmas*)

- Visit someone who is homebound, send cards, cook a meal, call them, etc.
- Visit someone who is hospitalized or who is in residential care.

- Pray for Christians around the world who are persecuted, imprisoned and even martyred for their faith.
