### **Pastor's Corner**

The importance of prayer in our relationship with God cannot be over emphasized. And this is the key message of today's liturgy: pray always and never to lose heart. Ours is a God who listens and answers our prayers. He is always close to the broken hearted and raises all those who are bowed down. He "never abandons any of us but instead is always with us, seeking to form us as wonderful and loving human beings who have the strength to do what is right and good."

### **The Widow and the Unjust Judge**

In the gospel, Luke tells the story of a widow and the judge who neither feared God nor had respect for any human being! We don't know the details of the widow's case, which she brings before the judge. She is not asking the judge to favor her, only that he render a just decision. This widow is relentless! She just keeps pestering the judge until he says to himself: I better give a just decision lest she finally come and strike me.

### **Take Time to Pray**

If we take time to pray, God takes time to listen! God knows and understands our needs. Everything you need will come to you at a perfect time. What is important is to have faith in God. As someone once said: when we pray, God hears more than we say, answers more than we ask, gives more than we imagine in His own time and in His own way. ## **OLMM Mercy in Action**

### **October - Clothe the Naked**

**Reflect:** Works of mercy usually begin as acts of charity. Today it is essential that they become acts of justice to effect changes in structures that support poverty.

### **Take Action:**

- Donate new and gently used clothing to people in need through a charity such as *St. Vincent de Paul*.
- Buy socks and underwear for people in homeless shelters.
- Send warm winter clothes - jackets, sweaters to homeless shelters. If you knit or crochet, make some hats, gloves and scarves.
- Develop the practice of giving away one gently used article of clothing each time a new one is purchased.
- Purchase clothing from companies that pay workers just wages.
- Become an advocate for products that are not made in "sweat shops".
- Volunteer to assist older or disabled adults to shop for their clothing.

## **DEVELOPMENT & PEACE FALL 2016 CAMPAIGN**

This fall's campaign is carrying on the work of Pope Francis' climate change encyclical, *Laudato Si*, in that we are being called to push our government to put Canada's support behind small family farmers, whose agricultural methods replenish and nurture the soil, helping to curb the adverse effects of climate change. Most small family farming is done in the developing world. D & P supports the efforts of small family farmers by distributing drought resistant seeds, providing wells for sustainable irrigation systems, setting up community gardens for the planting of new and varied crops, as well as by helping with funding for equipment and credit. D & P is working to move small family farmers beyond the poverty of subsistence agriculture. Signing a D & P Action card (available in the side foyer on the D&P display table) is one simple step we can each take to further this work.
