Pastor's Corner

Our liturgy today highlights the end of the world which will happen one day. However, for those who believe in the Lord God, the end of the world means the beginning of a new world. We shall enjoy this new beginning if only we live well in the present life! Although we are not told the exact date and time when the world will end, the real teaching in today's gospel is about how to live in this world here and now. As noted by Abbot Philip, even if it looks like everything is about to end, the most important aspect is for us to remain faithful to God and to God's word. So Saint Luke tells us: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Perseverance in the faith, perseverance in love, perseverance in service to others.

End of the Year of Mercy

As we are aware, the Jubilee Year of Mercy is coming to an end. It has been a year of spiritual renewal and rejuvenation during which we received divine mercy especially at the confessional. The Holy Door at the Notre Dame Cathedral-Basilica will be closed this weekend while next Sunday, November 20, will be the closing of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica. As the Holy Father, Pope Francis reminded us, the Holy Door is a symbol from sin to grace, signifying repentance and a new start. He encouraged Christians, especially Catholics, during the year to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Door in their diocese or elsewhere. I am so glad that a good number of our parishioners responded to the invitation and passed through the Holy Door. Now that the Year of Mercy is coming to an end, may we go out into the world to transform it by our acts of mercy and compassion, by becoming, in the words of the Holy Father, instruments of mercy! As we gradually approach the end of the liturgical year, may we focus on what really matters which is to remain faithful to the Lord Jesus and His church!

Take Action:
