In the Gospel for this Sunday a father asks both of his sons to go and work in his vineyard. The first one said no, but eventually changed his mind and went. The second one said he would go to the vineyard, but didn't. This story reminds us that there needs to be a correspondence between our actions and our words. It is easy to say the right thing. It is much harder to say and then do the right thing. And even though the first son eventually did as his father had requested, it took him a while to get it right.

In our first reading this Sunday from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel, we are reminded that if a person "turns from the wickedness he has committed, and does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life......"

Thoughts/Questions for Reflection:

- 1. When have your words been bold, while your actions have been inadequate? What were the consequences?
- 2. In the scriptures, Jesus seemed to focus a lot of time and energy on two different groups: The Pharisees, and the Tax Collectors and Prostitutes. Why do you think that was?
- 3. In regard to the second reading, what does it mean for you to have the same attitude as Iesus Christ?

DEVELOPMENT & PEACE FALL 2017 CAMPAIGN: WOMEN AT THE HEART OF PEACE: MAY PEACE BE UPON HER

Now is the time to sign the D&P action card, asking Prime Minister Justin Trudeau to support women and women's organisations, working for peace, and to develop a tangible strategy toward directing more funds to international development aid. With the recent boost of 70% to Canada's military budget over the next decade, Canada's international development aid currently stands at a woeful 0.26% of her GNI, far below the 0.07% target set by the United Nations.

Please join me in signing the D&P action card, which you will find in the white coloured wicker basket on the round table in the foyer. Our Diocese is now collecting the #s of signed cards by each parish; I challenge you all to beat the minimum target of 15.

You may also sign a D&P membership form (in the same place). For a small monthly sum, you can support D&P's work for development & peace, which is built on the pillars of Catholic Social Teaching: the right of all people to Human Dignity; the common good; the preferential option for the poor; stewardship of creation; solidarity with the world's most marginalised peoples; subsidiarity & the role of government; economic justice, and peace.
