FALL 2020 CAMPAIGN

Since D&P is the Canadian social justice agency & our international aid organization, it is important that Canadian Catholics give our prayers & support to the poorest of the world's poor, as Christ's Social Gospel teaches, through Development & Peace annual campaigns. I invite you to read the D&P faith-based reflection, For the Care and Healing of our Common Home, which connects the COVID-19 pandemic with Laudato Si' and the need to act for a better world. (Available in the church foyer) You can also immerse yourself in our reflection on integral ecology and take our online intergenerational pledge to care for our common home at devp.org.

Development and Peace has signed onto the Six principles for a Just Recovery and is part of the new ecumenical campaign, For the Love of Creation. Educational resources and mobilization activities on both these initiatives will be brought to your attention throughout 2020/2021. You can sign an online petition until October 6th launched by the ecumenical initiative, For the Love of Creation that calls on the Government of Canada to:

- Commit to reducing Canadian Green House Gas (GHG) emissions by 60 percent below 2005 levels by 2030, and invest in a just transition;
- Honor the rights of Indigenous Peoples;
- Commit equal support for climate change adaptation and mitigation measures in the Global South; and
- Respond to the pandemic in the Global South.

Diocesan Centre is Relocating: The building housing the Diocesan Centre of the Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall at 1247 Kilborn Place is near the end of its lifespan. Diocesan administration is planning to relocate occupants of the John Paul II Residence for retired clergy by next spring. The Chancery and the Diocesan Centre offices will relocate before the end of this year.
