I. The cleaning of the heart

Blessed are the pure in heart for they will see God. <u>Matthew</u> 5:8

The word "blessed" literally means happy in the original Greek. From this statement of Jesus we see that the pure in heart are the happy in heart. Why? Simply because they will one day see God. Now this sounds really simple, doesn't it, because all that you need is a pure heart. The good news is that God is the one who cleans the heart and all that you need to do is ask Him. David asked God for this exact thing: Create in me a pure heart and renew a right spirit within me. (Psalm 51:10) God granted David's request and gave him a clean heart. III. The decorating of the heart

What does God do to decorate a heart?

I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. God decorates a heart by gutting the old and creating something new.

The Greek meaning of the word "receive" means "to welcome" or "to accept." John is making it clear that we are to welcome Christ into our lives. This receiving is not just for part or some of our life but rather it is for every area of our life. To believe in the name of Jesus means to put faith in Him as a person and in what he represents. The simple act is life changing and transforming because we become children of God. God has given us an incredible gift. By faith, in Christ, we can become children of God.


B. The giving of gifts
