Day 1, Sun, Sep 8

Ottawa-Dubrovnik

Fly from Ottawa to Dubrovnik via Montreal and Vienna.

Day 2, Mon, Sep 9

Dubrovnik

Arrive in Dubrovnik, Croatia, get settled, and relax in the hotel. Then, celebrate Mass, dinner, and a restful night.

Day 3, Tues, Sep 10
